Biosecurity on Scotland's seabird islands: past,

present and future...



Scotland's islands are home to globally significant populations of seabirds — and they are in trouble.

Scotland's seabird indicator populations have declined by 49% between 1986 and 2019.



These declines are driven by climate change and declines in food supply, by-catch in fisheries, and invasive non-native predators.









**Invasive Non-Native Mammalian Predators** All may predate on seabirds, their chicks, and their eggs.




Burrow-nesting seabirds are especially vulnerable to them.



## Biosecurity can safeguard seabirds



#### **Prevention**

Putting barriers in place to stop predators reaching islands.



#### **Surveillance**

Tools to let us quickly detect if a predator has made it to an island.



#### **Incursion Response**

Rapidly responding to ensure the predator can't breed and spread.


