















Scottish Red Squirrel Context




Approximately 75% of the UK's remaining red squirrels can be found in Scotland

Primarily a species conservation issue Increasing attention as an INNS and forestry issue

2015 Scottish Strategy for Red Squirrel Conservation, published by the Scottish Squirrel Group

Delivered to date by Saving Scotland's Red Squirrels (SSRS) project






























SSRS Strategic Aims

- 1. Protect red only population north of the highland line
- 2. Support red squirrels in selected areas where greys also occur
- **NE** eradicate & prevent immigration from south
- Central Lowlands contain spread of greys and SQPV below Highland Line
- **South** reduce density of grey squirrels in priority areas & promote long term volunteer control efforts



Northeast Scotland - why eradication?



- 1971 single, accidental, introduction event in Aberdeen city
- 10-20 individuals from southern Britain
 - Small founding population
 - Remained geographically and genetically isolated from mainland population
- If not managed Grampian & Highland red squirrels at risk
- If successful first eradication of invasive urban grey squirrel population
- Significant lag of c.40 years before action taken
- ££ cost of inaction in early stages of colonisation has been huge
 - Estimated at >£1.5M to date








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




Scale at A4: 1:475,000





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
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Red Squirrel Records 2022





Pine marten recovery in 2022
