## Scottish Invasive Species Initiative - your role:

Led by NatureScot, the Scottish Invasive Species Initiative, the largest invasive species control programme in Great Britain, has been operating since 2018. After a successful first phase and having secured new funding, we are starting a second phase of activity from 2023 to 2026 and recruiting new staff to add to our team. We work with and encourage volunteers and communities to tackle invasive non-native species such as Japanese knotweed, giant hogweed, Himalayan balsam and American mink. We are looking for a dynamic professional to join us as a Project Officer working with our partners the Cromarty Firth, Ness District and Beauly District Salmon Fishery Boards and covering the rivers of these districts.

The Project Officer will act as a key local point of contact for the project and work with the Project Manager and project team to deliver our activities and ensure that outputs and outcomes will be secure after the project finishes. Locally you will be responsible for all or specified combinations of the following aspects of the project: communications, education and outreach, volunteer recruitment and management, biosecurity, invasive non-native species control and restoration trials.
